Former Llanfair school repurposing leadership steering group

Notes from Zoom meeting held on 16 November 2021

1. Present were Toria Collins, Phil Bennett-Lloyd Richard Cotter and Steve Whipp. Apologies had been received from Caroline Ross and Helen Stalford
2. The notes from last meeting of 14 October 2021 were agreed.
3. Actions from the 14 October meeting:
 - a. There remained a need to complete the write-up of the community consultation for the school and playing field from the open day in July 2021 **(TC and HS to action)**.
 - b. Eirwen Godden advised that Llyr Williams had been instructed to act on behalf of the Community Council with regard to the Community Asset Transfer. Eirwen would follow up with Llyr to ensure he was happy with the briefing and would advise on what support Llyr would need. Eirwen would also seek indicative timescales from Llyr on how long he would expect the CAT process to take. **(EG to contact LW and report back)**.
 - c. Eirwen would also inform Becky Williams at DCC of Llyr's appointment once it was confirmed. **(EG to advise BW)**.
 - d. Eirwen advised that Geraint Roberts had been appointed to undertake the structural survey of the school building. Eirwen would let the steering group know what support Geraint would need. GR had already requested reports held by DCC and these had been provided. Some 11 reports had been forwarded. **(EG to identify support needed by GR and report to the steering group)**.
 - e. Eirwen further advised that ArbTech would be appointed to undertake the survey of the playing field and to advise on future management of the trees and shrubs. Eirwen would identify the support that ArbTech might need. **(EG to identify support needed by ArbTech and report to the steering group)**.
 - f. Eirwen Godden had consulted the Community Council standing orders and advised that a management group for the new assets to be transferred would be formed. This could include members from the steering group, community councillors as well as other volunteers from the community.
 - g. Eirwen reported that the proposed cost for providing a fence to the playing field had been received from Gethin Lloyd. EG would advise GL that no action would take place until the CAT had been completed. **(EG to thank all fencing proposers for their responses)**.
 - h. SW had sent a basic Gantt chart with the meeting invitation that would be developed further by the steering group. Key to its development would be time estimates from Llyr Williams. **(All to consider the future plan timetable)**.
 - i. Phil Bennet-Lloyd had agreed to approach the wind farm funding bodies with Buddug Williams. SW suggested sending a copy of the steering group minutes to start a conversation. **(PBL and BW to send meeting notes to Wind Farm grant bodies)**.

- j. Buddug Williams had agreed to put more detail into the chapter contents of the stage 3 business case for the school building and playground. This would help others in developing the business case. SW agreed to ask BW for an update. It would be good to keep the momentum in building the business case that could then be used to carry out a SWOT analysis to see where more detail was needed. **(SW to contact BW)**.
 - k. SW had tabled a draft skeleton for a questionnaire for anybody expressing an interest in using the assets. **All were encouraged to review and comment.**
4. The meeting heard feedback from the presentation given by Darren Millar MS given to the Community Council meeting of 8 November 2021. DM made several comments in relation to the future development of the school and the playing field. He was supportive of the CAT and stated that the business cases for the assets needed to show how the assets would support the community and in a sustainable manner. DM stressed that to attract funding the school would need to offer different amenity to that provided by Neuadd Eleanor. He saw the proposals as giving a new lease of life to these well-loved assets by doing something different. With regard to accessing funding it would be helpful to demonstrate how any proposal would generate real economic benefit to the region. DM encourage engagement with our MP to access levelling-up funds.
 5. The Steering Group had identified a potential funding opportunity through the Green Communities Fund and SW had submitted a preliminary bid to Cadwyn Clwyd. The business case for the playing field had been included. (CC requested a meeting on site which was held on 17/November 2021. At this the playing field was visited and CC advised that the proposal for the field aligned well with the fund objectives. CC need to be informed about when the CAT would be completed and would then formalise a more detailed proposal. Toria Collins agreed to keep this moving by liaising with CC to develop the detailed grant fund proposal).
 6. The steering group agreed that it would continue to develop the stage 3 CAT business case for the school building.
 7. The date for the next meeting of the steering group would be Thursday 16 December at 7pm

Rwyf yn cysylltu er mwyn eich diweddarau chi ar y penderfyniadau allweddol a wnaed gan Weinidogion Cymru yn ystod yr wythnosau diwethaf mewn perthynas â Rheolau Etholiadau Lleol (Prif Ardaloedd) (Cymru) (Rheolau) 2021 ac Etholiadau Lleol (Cymunedau) (Cymru) 2021.

Fel yr eglurodd y ddogfen ymgynghori, mae'r rhan fwyaf o'r rheolau sy'n llywodraethu etholiadau lleol yn aros yr un fath ag ar gyfer blynyddoedd blaenorol ac eithrio newidiadau a wnaed yn angenrheidiol gan yr estyniad i'r etholfraint. Fodd bynnag, roedd nifer o reolau drafft ychwanegol hefyd yn cynnwys y rhai a oedd yn gweithredu'r cynigion a gynhwyswyd yn yr ymgynghoriad ar *Ddiwygio Etholiadol mewn Llywodraeth Leol yng Nghymru*. Yn dilyn yr ymgynghoriad ar y rheolau drafft, mae Gweinidogion wedi penderfynu sut y bydd y newidiadau hyn a newidiadau eraill yn cael eu datblygu fel a ganlyn:

- *Cyfeiriad cartref yr ymgeisydd*

Yn unol â'r dull a ddefnyddir mewn etholiadau eraill, bydd yn ofynnol i ymgeiswyr gynnwys ffurflen cyfeiriad cartref ar wahân gyda'u papur enwebu. Bydd hyn yn caniatáu i ymgeisydd ddweud nad ydynt am i'w cyfeiriad cartref gael ei gyhoeddi.

- *Datganiad o ymlyniad pleidiau gwleidyddol*

Cynhwyswyd rheol ddrafft newydd yn yr ymgynghoriad a oedd yn ei gwneud yn ofynnol i ymgeiswyr gynnwys, ar ffurflenni enwebu, fanylion aelodaeth y pleidiau gwleidyddol yn y 12 mis blaenorol. Bydd y ddarpariaeth hon yn aros yn y rheolau terfynol ond fe'i diwygir i egluro'r bwriad na fydd yn ofynnol i Swyddogion Canlyniadau wirio'r wybodaeth (a fydd ar gael i'r cyhoedd) neu weithredu ar gyhuddiadau o wybodaeth ffug.

- *Datganiad personol i ymgeiswyr*

O ystyried yr oedi wrth wneud y Rheolau hyn oherwydd Covid, mae Gweinidogion wedi ystyried adborth ac wedi penderfynu na fydd datganiadau ymgeiswyr yn cael eu gweithredu ar gyfer yr etholiadau lleol yn 2022. Fodd bynnag, byddant yn cael eu datblygu yn y dyfodol agos o ystyried pwysigrwydd cefnogi etholwyr i gael gafael ar wybodaeth am y rhai sy'n dymuno eu cynrychioli.

- *Cyflwyno ffurflenni enwebu ymgeiswyr yn electronig*

Mae'r ddarpariaeth hon yn y rheolau drafft yn caniatáu i'r Swyddog Canlyniadau ystyried cynnig opsiwn i ymgeiswyr gyflwyno'r ffurflenni enwebiad yn electronig. Roedd y rheolau drafft yn cynnig mai'r Swyddog Canlyniadau ddylai fod yn gyfrifol am y penderfyniad i wneud hynny. Bydd y rheol ddiwygiedig yn ei gwneud yn ofynnol i Swyddogion Canlyniadau alluogi ymgeiswyr i gyflwyno enwebiadau'n electronig. Rydym yn disgwyl i'r rhan fwyaf o awdurdodau lleol dderbyn ffurflenni enwebiadau drwy e-bost, ond os gall yr awdurdod lleol creu ddarparu ar gyfer cyflwyno ar-lein, bydd y Swyddog Canlyniadau yn gallu gwneud hynny. Fodd bynnag, bydd rhaid iddynt allu derbyn enwebiadau gan o leiaf un o'r trefniadau hyn. Mae'r opsiwn i ymgeiswyr gyflwyno enwebiad yn bersonol yn parhau hefyd.

Felly nid oes unrhyw anghydfod ynghylch a yw enwebiad a gyflwynir yn electronig wedi'i gyflwyno mewn pryd, bydd y rheol newydd yn ei gwneud yn ofynnol i'r papur enwebu fod wedi ymddangos yn system gyfrifiadurol yr awdurdod lletyol cyn i'r enwebiadau ddod i ben. Bydd yn ddyletswydd ar yr ymgeisydd i sicrhau bod y papur enwebu wedi'i dderbyn mewn pryd – yn yr un modd ag y mae'n gyfrifoldeb ar yr ymgeisydd i sicrhau bod ei bapur enwebu wedi'i gyflwyno â llaw cyn y dyddiad cau ac yn gywir.

- *Fformiwla Asiantau Cyfrif ac asiantau pleidleisio*

Roedd y Rheolau drafft yn dileu'r fformiwla'u presennol sy'n gysylltiedig ag asiantau pleidleisio a'r chyfri ac yn caniatáu i'r Swyddog Canlyniadau benderfynu ar niferoedd. Fodd bynnag, yng ngoleuni'r ymatebion i'r ymgynghoriad a dysgu o etholiad y Senedd, caiff y fformiwla'u eu hadfer yn y Rheolau terfynol.

- *Annibynnol/ Annibynnol*

Gwnaed darpariaeth bellach yn y Rheolau i ymgeisydd annibynnol gynnwys ar bapur enwebu'r term "Independent", "Annibynnol" neu'r ddau air.

- *Amserlen a Rheolau canlyniadol*

Er mwyn i'r amserlen bresennol ar gyfer dod i rym ym mis Rhagfyr gael ei bodloni, bydd angen gwneud rhai diwygiadau canlyniadol sy'n deillio o'r newidiadau a gyflwynir yn y Rheolau mewn set eilaidd o reoliadau. Bydd y diwygiadau canlyniadol hyn yn dechnegol eu natur yn bennaf (er enghraifft, diwygio'r ddwy set o Reolau 2006 fel nad ydynt yn gymwys yng Nghymru mwyach) ac nid oes angen cynllunio'r etholiad i ddechrau.

Dear all

I am emailing to update you on the key decisions taken by Welsh Ministers in recent weeks in respect of the Local Elections (Principal Areas) (Wales) (Rules) 2021 and Local Elections (Communities) (Wales) Rules 2021.

As the consultation document made clear, the majority of the rules governing local elections remain the same as for previous years excepting changes made necessary by the extension to the franchise. However, there were also several additional draft rules included which gave effect to the

proposals contained in the Electoral Reform in Local Government in Wales consultation. Following the consultation on the draft rules, Ministers have made decision on how these and other changes will be progressed as follows:

Candidate's home address

In line with the approach taken in other elections, candidates will be required to include with their nomination paper a separate home address form. This will allow a candidate to state that they do not want their home address to be made public or published.

Statement of political party affiliation

A new draft rule was included in the consultation which required candidates to include, on nomination forms, details of political party membership in the preceding 12 months. This provision will remain in the final rules but is amended to make clear the intention that Returning Officers will not be required to check the information (which will be publically available) or to act on accusations of false information.

Personal statement for candidates

Given the delay in making these Rules due to Covid, Ministers have taken on board feedback and have decided that candidate statements will not be implemented for the local elections in 2022. However, they will be subsequently taken forward in the near future given the importance of supporting electors in accessing information around those wishing to represent them.

Electronic submission of candidate nomination forms

This provision in the draft rules allows for the Returning Officer to consider offering an option to candidates to submit the nomination electronically. The draft rules proposed that the decision to do so should rest with the Returning Officer. The revised rule will make it a requirement for Returning Officers to enable candidates to submit nominations electronically. We expect most local authorities to receive the nominations by email, but if the local authority is able to provide for online submission, the Returning Officer will be able to do so. In any event, they must be able to receive nominations by at least one of these arrangements. The option for candidates to submit nomination in person remains as well.

So there is no dispute as to whether a nomination submitted electronically has been submitted in time, the new rule will require the nomination paper to have appeared in the host authority's computer system before the close of nominations. It will be incumbent on the candidate to make sure the nomination paper has been received in time – in the same way as it is the candidate's responsibility to ensure their nomination paper has been delivered manually before the deadline and is correct.

Counting Agents and polling agents formula

The draft Rules removed the current formulas associated with polling and counting agents and allowed numbers to be determined by the Returning Officer. However, in light of responses to the consultation and learning from the Senedd election the formulas are reinstated in the final Rules.

Independent/ Annibynnol

Further provision has been made in the Rules for an independent candidate to include on a nomination paper the term “Independent”, “Annibynnol” or both those words.

Timetable and Consequential rules

In order that the current timetable for having the Rules come into force in December may be met, certain consequential amendments arising from the changes introduced in the Rules will need to be made in a secondary set of regulations. These consequential amendments will be mainly technical in nature (for example, amending both sets of 2006 Rules so they no longer apply in Wales) and are not necessary for planning the election to commence.

“Hi All

I hope this email finds you well. You may well have noticed recently when visiting Graig Wyllt that a large number of trees have been tagged and painted. Several trees have also been tagged at Coed Cilygroeslwyd, but to a much lesser extent. We have been prompted to do this by the spread of ash dieback, a fungal disease which affects ash trees. If you want to know more about ash dieback, this page on the Wildlife Trusts website provides some useful information: <https://www.wildlifetrusts.org/ash-dieback>.

At NWWT, we are aware that ash dieback has spread significantly across the UK over the past few years. This disease will undoubtedly cause a significant shift in the composition of our woodlands, just as Dutch Elm Disease has done before it. As such, this has prompted us to develop an Ash Dieback Action Plan (ADAP). Our ADAP is based on Section 8 of the Tree Council ADAP. This Plan helps us to identify and manage the risks from the disease on our nature reserves (to landscape and biodiversity), to public safety (falling trees) infrastructure (boundaries and buildings) and to communication networks (roads and overhead cables). We've set about undertaking a tree safety audit across all our nature reserves and have focused on assessing trees which are close to footpaths, neighbouring property, roads and overhead cables. Affected ash trees in much less frequented parts of our reserves, where the public do not access and where there is considered to be a very low risk, will be left in situ. While we don't want to fell any trees, we do think it is necessary where the trees could pose a considerable risk to life or property.

Unfortunately, my tree safety survey at Graig Wyllt highlighted that the reserve contains the second highest volume of ash dieback affected trees (near paths, properties and infrastructure) out all NWWT reserves in NE Wales. These trees potentially pose a high risk to public safety, infrastructure and communication networks. Ash is the dominant species in the woodland at Graig Wyllt, and the extent of felling works likely required to deal with ADB will significantly impact the woodland. However, the spread of ash dieback across Graig Wyllt is not uniform, with trees along the western boundary (path running alongside the kiln) being much more severely affected than trees in the woodland further east and north in the reserve.

Given how steep and exposed the slope is on the western path that runs near the kiln, I felt that those ash dieback affected trees pose a significantly greater risk to human life and infrastructure. Trees tagged with orange paint will be monitored by NWWT to determine whether their condition improves or worsens over time. Trees tagged with red paint are those deemed to be the highest risk, which we plan to fell, pollard or de-limb as appropriate. Due to the extent of affected ash, we are likely to bring in contractors to do the majority of the works, where possible. We will target the most high risk trees for felling this winter, 2021/22, while tree safety checks and some felling (likely to a lesser extent) will continue annually as necessary, outside the bird nesting season. Of course, we also need to consider bats and other protected species which might be affected by the works, and will carry out surveys for bats and follow avoidance measures to minimise any risk to wildlife, as necessary.

Although the results will be stark, we believe that felling these dangerous trees will encourage diversity in age and sizes of the woodland, which will benefit birds, invertebrates and fungi, which is one of our management objectives for the reserve. The prevalence of ash dieback along the

western boundary also provides great potential to lengthen the woodland edge habitat available for invertebrates by improved management of the rides and footpaths. I suggest that we develop a woodland management program once the tree safety works are complete to provide clear aims on the management objectives for the woodland, which will direct future woodland management and include encouraging regenerating trees in the affected areas. This will include organising more volunteer work parties to help manage the woodland in the future, for which I would very much appreciate any support you might be able to offer.

I hope the above provides some further clarity on why there are so many trees tagged at Graig Wylt. I'll make sure the Llanfair-Fyw group are aware of any developments that are likely to be happening in the future on this matter, either directly or through Iwan and the Llanfair-Fyw meetings. Hi Eirwen

I've been on leave for the last week so please accept my apologies for not getting back to you.

I'm unconvinced that traffic calming is a viable solution for Graigfechan. As discussed previously horizontal features, such as build-outs, would not be appropriate because of low traffic volumes and other factors such as forward visibility. Vertical features, such as speed cushions, could prove to be more successful at reducing speeds, however they have proved to be very unpopular in other rural communities. For example the associated noise disturbance, issues with agricultural vehicles and problems during periods of snow have led to them being removed from Llandegla for example.

In addition to the above we do not have an internal budget for traffic calming schemes of this nature and any funding would need to be sourced from WG's Road Safe grant. This grant is prioritised at areas with high collision levels, particularly those involving pedestrians and other vulnerable road users, and as it stands the existing collision levels in Graigfechan are low.

Given that the community council do not favour the introduction of a speed indicator device I would suggest that we revisit the situation with Go Safe. I believe that we can present a compelling case for them to undertake an enforcement campaign in the village over the next few months. Following on from this the speed limit will potentially be reduced from 30mph to 20mph in Graigfechan in 2023, as part of changes being introduced by the Welsh Assembly Government. This will also have a positive effect on the speed of vehicles through the village.

I would be happy to discuss the situation with the community council if required.

Eisteddfod Genedlaethol Urdd Gobaith Cymru Sir Ddinbych 2022

Fel y gwyddoch, mae Eisteddfod yr Urdd yn cael ei chynnal yn Sir Ddinbych ym mis Mai 2022. Yn anffodus mae'r Urdd wedi gorfod gohиро'r Eisteddfod y ddwy flynedd diwethaf oherwydd cyfyngiadau COVID-19.

Mae Eisteddfod yr Urdd yn ddibynnol ar roddion hael Cynghorau Tref a Chymuned yn yr ardal leol fyddai'n gallu cyfrannu at ddarpariaeth celfyddydol plant a phobl ifanc y Sir.

Bydd Eisteddfod yr Urdd Sir Ddinbych yn denu 90,000 o ymwelwyr a 55,000 o gystadleuwyr. Er mwyn cynnal Gŵyl lwyddiannus, rydym yn ddibynnol ar gefnogaeth unigolion, mudiadau a sefydliadau lleol a thrwy Gymru gyfan. Heb y gefnogaeth leol yn ymarferol ac yn ariannol, ni fydd modd i ni gynnal yr Ŵyl. Fe fydd yr Eisteddfod yn Sir Ddinbych yn 2022 yn costio dros £1.8miliwn.

As you may be aware, the Urdd Eisteddfod will be visiting Denbighshire in May 2022. Unfortunately, the Urdd has had to delay the Eisteddfod the last two years due to the restrictions of COVID-19.
